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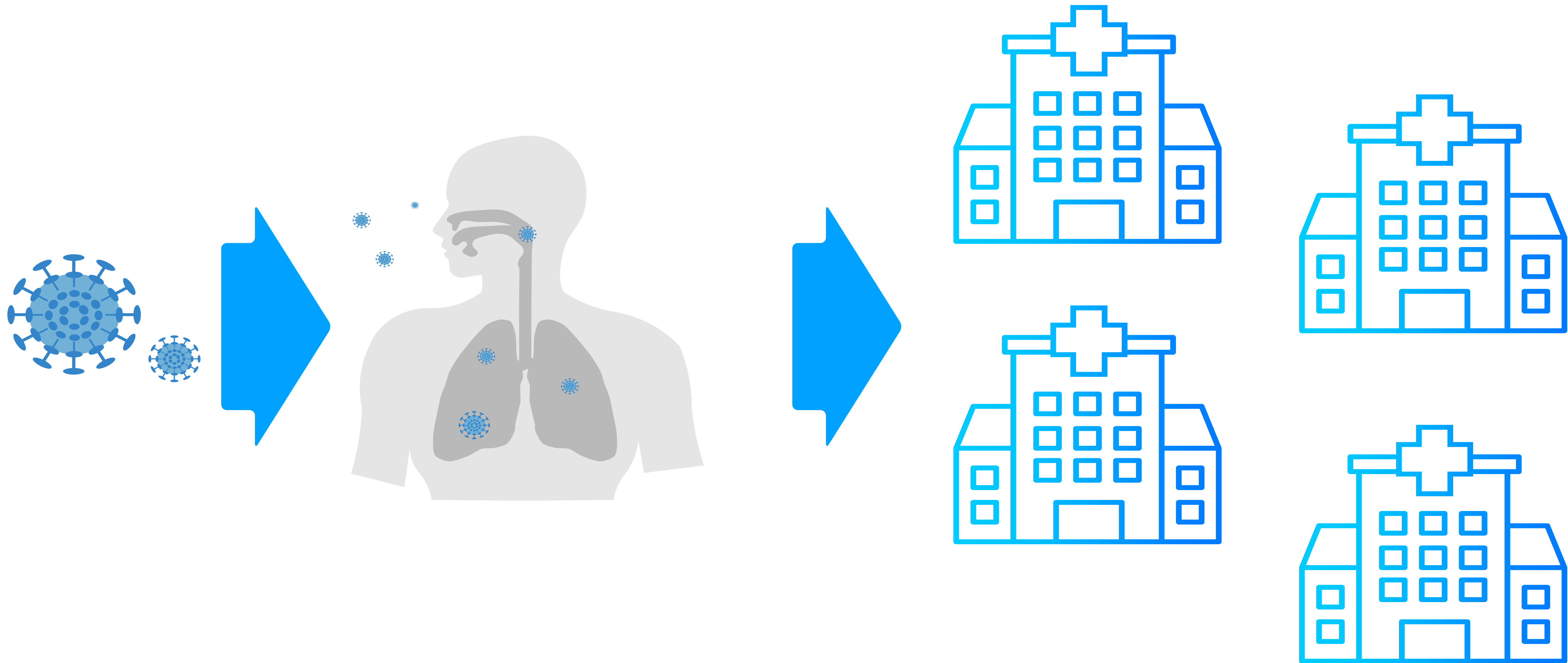

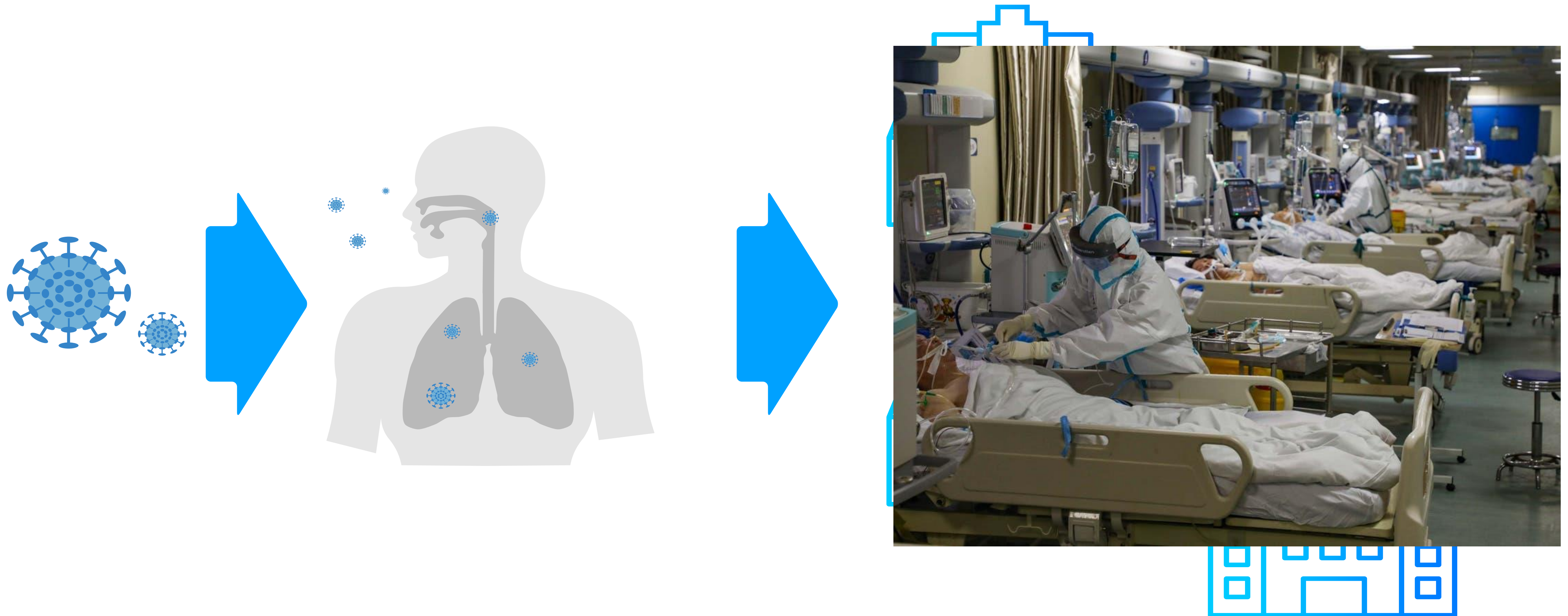

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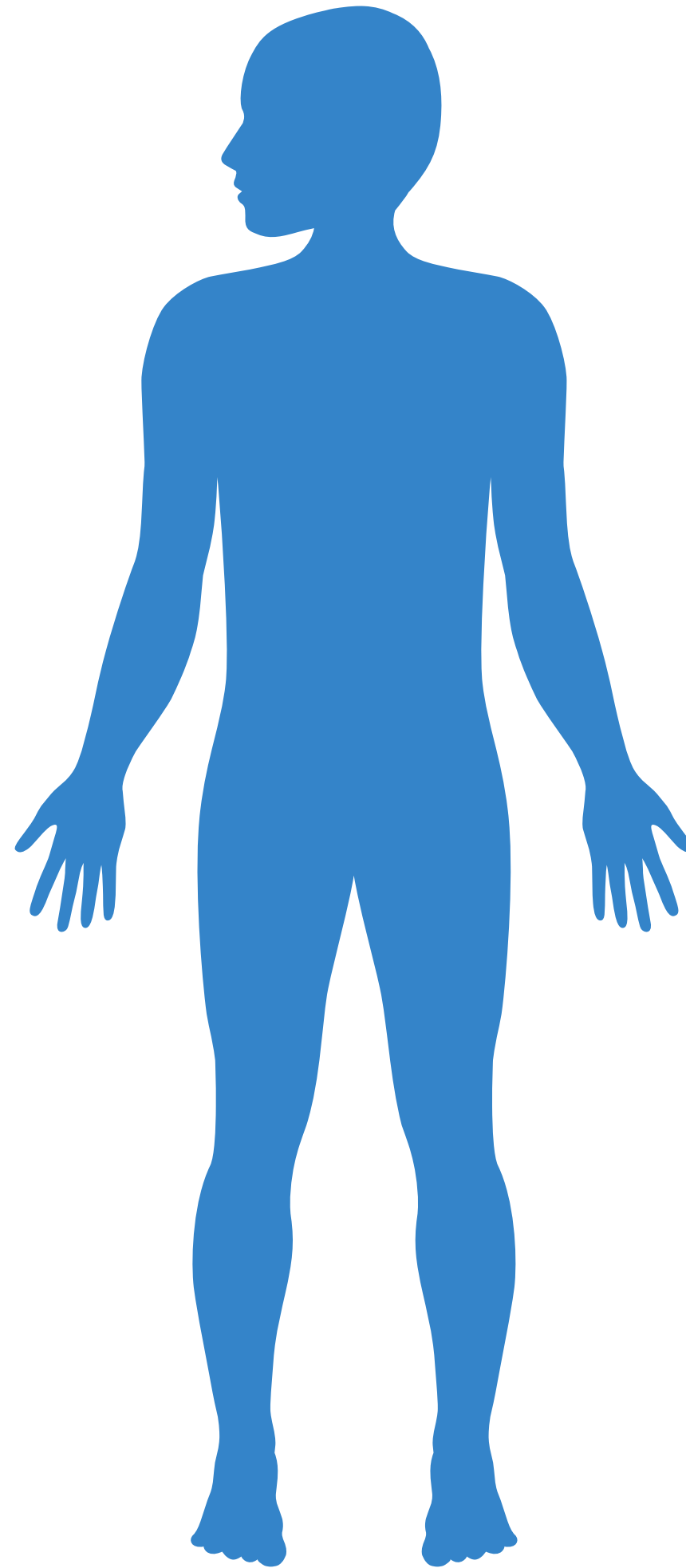
Uncertainty vs Control

2. Our capacity is dependent on individual and community behaviors



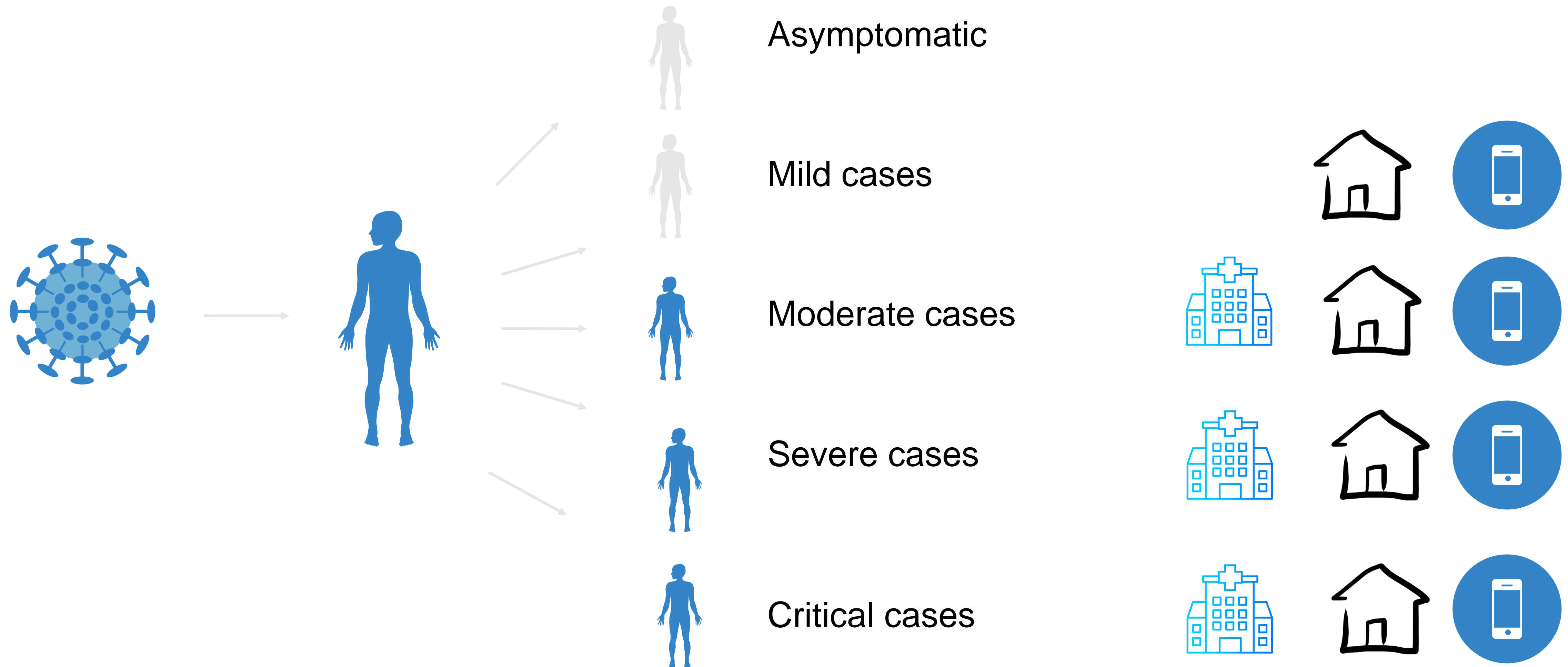
Hospital related measures put in place

3. Need to redefine healthcare provision to deal with covid-19 patient needs

- Clarify **first-point-of-contact strategy** for possible COVID19 cases: **phone**, online, physical.
- Protect other potential **first-contact health system** entry point
- **Designate hospitals** to receive COVID19 patients and prepare to mobilize **surge acute and ICU capacity**.
- Organize and **expand services close to home** for COVID19 response.
- **Train, repurpose and mobilize the health workforce** according to priority services.
- **Protect the physical health of frontline health workers**.
- Anticipate and address the **mental health needs of the health workforce**.
- **Maintain continuity of essential services** while freeing up capacity for COVID19 response.

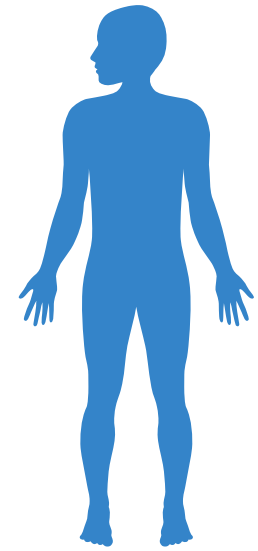
Hospital role on Covid-19 is limited

4. Integrated, centered and tailored patient care



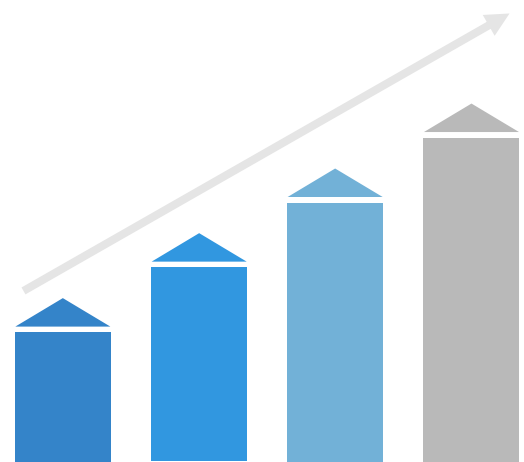
Short-term consequences

- Increase of unemployment and poverty will be have consequences in health needs

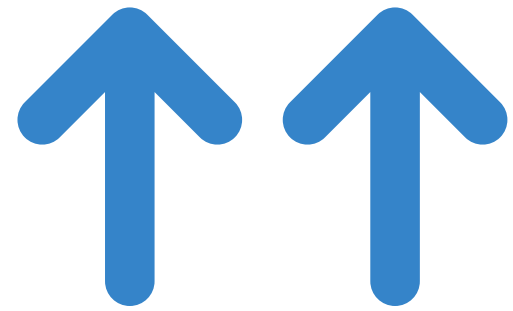


Higher operational costs:

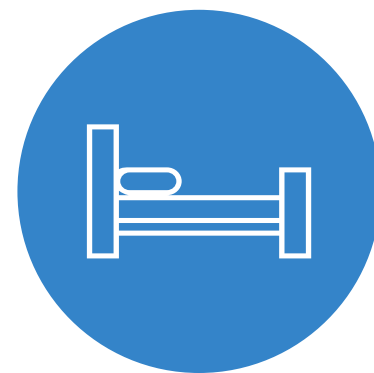
